Conservation and wine

With 95% of South Africa's wine produced in the Cape winelands, vines and other crops compete for space with the Cape's unique vegetation.

In the early 2000s there was rapid expansion of vineyards into highly threatened conservation-worthy habitats. In response – from 2005 to 2015 – a unique conservation sector, landowner and wine industry partnership achieved turnaround results. It was called the Biodiversity and Wine Initiative.

It created widespread awareness of our unique natural heritage, and many farms now carry out biodiversity-friendly farming.

The SA wine industry has been globally recognised as demonstrating this fine balance between nature and farming.

Champions of nature

Through the partnership, SA's industry-wide sustainable wine certification scheme (IPW) now includes the protection and management of natural areas amongst its criteria. And one third of the wine industry has



detailed plans to help manage their agricultural and natural areas.

However, environmental risks and challenges continue...

Opportunities need to be approached together – on a regional or catchment level. Dedicated farm owners are stepping up as true custodians of the land and catalysing action beyond their farm gates. They are the environmental industry leaders! They are the Conservation Champions... id vou know

Cape sugarbirds only occur in the Cape Floral Kingdom, feeding mostly on the nectar of flowering proteas and playing a crucial role in pollinating these indigenous flowers. As proteas become restricted due to habitat loss, so the sugarbirds' existence is affected. A perfect icon of nature's synergistic relationships.
